



# Days 3 & 4: PROVENCE



Drive through the most beautiful countryside villages



The old city is impossible to resist, with its UNESCO World Heritage sites and lively world-famous festivals, including the renowned "Rencontres de la Photographie". It's also where psychotic yet prolific Van Gogh painted around 300 artworks!

#### Back in Time to Ancient Rome



Les "Arènes": an impeccably kept amphitheatre dating back to 90AD whose sheer size was a reflection of Arles' might on the trading route between Spain and Italy. At 107 metres wide and 136 metres long, the massive amphitheatre could hold 21,000 spectators that would have come to watch gruesome gladiator fights.

#### **Arles Amphitheatre**



The renowned Impressionist artist spent a little over a year living in Arles, but it was an extremely prolific period for him, creating over 300 drawings and paintings, between February 1888 and May 1889. Van Gogh's work from Arles is often associated with the yellow colour, which plays a prominent role in his works from that period.

Sample local specialties like anchoïade (an antipasto dish with anchovies, grilled bell peppers, egg, and olives) or fougasse (a focaccia-type bread used to make French calzone, which can include goat cheese or Roquefort, lardons, fruit, walnuts, or olives).


## DAY 4: LES BAUX DE PROVENCE


